

8/18/12 Update: 1500 N. Construction Begins Monday, Aug. 20

Construction will begin during the **week of August 20** on the first phase of the Cache Water Restoration Project (CWRP). The initial phase of construction involves installation of a pressurized irrigation pipeline along the 1500 North roadway corridor between the Logan and Northern and Logan Hyde Park Smithfield Canals in Logan.

Schedule: During the week of August 20, preparations for pipeline installation will begin as crews begin utility relocations on 1500 North between 1350 East and 1800 East. Clearing and tree removal will take place in the 1500 North corridor between 1200 East and 1350 East.

- Crews plan to work Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily.
- Pipeline installation and roadway restoration along 1500 North is expected to continue through late fall 2012.

Traffic Impacts: Residents along 1500 North and commuters in the area are advised of traffic impacts between 1200 East and 1800 East. Motorists should expect traffic shifts and narrow travel lanes.

- Traffic will be shifted to the south side of 1500 North between 1350 East and 1600 East and one travel lane will be maintained in each direction.
- From 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., 1500 North will be open to local traffic only between 1600 East and Aspen Drive (1950 East). Detours will be in place for through traffic.
- On-street parking is prohibited on 1500 North in the work zone.

Temporary Utility/Driveway Impacts: Residents on 1500 North should expect temporary (up to one day between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.) utility service (water and sewer) interruptions and driveway closures during utility relocations.

- 24-hour advance notice will be provided for utility/driveway impacts and crews will coordinate individually with homeowners.
- Utility relocations are expected to continue through approximately mid-September.

Bus Service: Cache Valley Transit District (CVTD) bus service will continue operations on the current schedule. No changes are planned to the existing bus stops at this time.

Garbage Collection: City garbage collection will continue along 1500 North on the regular Wednesday curb-side pick-up schedule. Residences where work is occurring may need to temporarily use alternate pick-up areas and construction crews will notify affected homeowners when this is necessary.

Safety: Pipeline installation involves open trenches and heavy construction equipment. To maintain public safety in the work zone, residents are asked to avoid open trenches and take appropriate safety measures with children.

Look Ahead: Construction of subsequent phases of the CWRP are expected to begin by late fall 2012.
